Green Industries Best Management Practices (GI-BMPs) is a science based educational program for people working in lawn-care and landscape maintenance. The GI-BMP program teaches environmentally safe landscaping practices that help conserve and protect Florida's ground and surface waters. Beginning January 2014 the GI-BMP training is required for anyone who applies fertilizer commercially.
